1820 MISSOURI COMPROMISE

- Proposed by Henry Clay to deal with the issue of slavery in the Louisiana Territory.

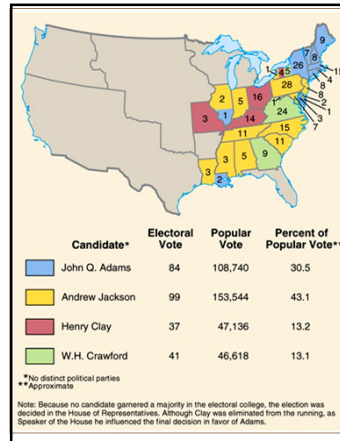


- Compromise parts:
 - Missouri** 24th state - first created from Louisiana Territory - Slavery allowed
 - Maine** 25th state - created out of Massachusetts - Free State
 - Senate continues divided evenly between northern free states and southern slave states - Balance of Power maintained
 - Missouri Compromise Line** - for new states
 - North of Line [Missouri southern border] = No Slavery
 - South of Line [Missouri southern border] = Slavery

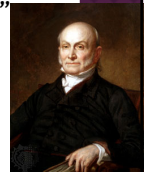
ELECTION OF 1824

- Andrew Jackson**—War of 1812
- John Quincy Adams**--Monroe's Sec. of State. Candidate of Easterners and establishment.
- Henry Clay** -Also a westerner and natural regional rival of Jackson. But much different view of role of national government.
- William Crawford**—Southerner (GA)

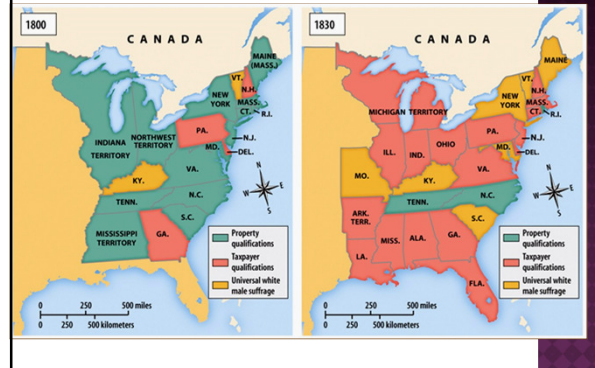
